The members of the Association may choose to seek redress under the rules of the Association. The rules contain provisions for the members to direct the secretary of the Association to convene a Special General Meeting to resolve the issues.

The Associations Incorporation Act 1981 provides that the rules of an association constitute the terms of a contract between the members and the association. If any of the members feel that they have been deprived of their rights through non-observance of the Association's rules, it is their right to take appropriate action. The Act specifically provides for the rights and obligations of members, and the Supreme Court has jurisdiction over the decisions of the Association.
